

QUESTIONS

Remember this is a dialogue, not a quiz. The questions are a good start to draw out observations about the story, and the “answers” are just there to help you guide kids toward some key ideas.

- 1. Do you think Jesus was really raised from the dead?**
- 2. What do you hear in this story that makes you believe Jesus rose from the dead?**
- 3. What was Jesus' command right before leaving His disciples? Is this command also for us today?**
- 4. What is a disciple?**
- 5. How do you make a disciple?**
- 6. What did Jesus say about God's Spirit?**
 - God's Spirit will come and live inside of you, giving you peace and leading you in all the ways of truth.
- 7. What was the covenant God made with Abraham and His people? What did it require?**
- 8. How did God make a new covenant with His people? What is the new covenant?**
